## Student Drop Off and Pick Up:

Student safety is our number one priority, especially during morning drop off and afternoon dismissal. Please follow all traffic signs and park/stop your vehicle accordingly so not to impact on the arrival and departure of buses, as well as the safe drop off/pick up of students.

We have set up Traffic Pylons as traffic calming measures so there is no confusion on where our community members can and cannot park during the day. Places families can park are as follows:

- <u>Wimbledon Rd</u> Parking is available on Wimbledon Rd between Atwood Terrace and the School driveway.
- <u>Basinview Dr</u> There is parking on Basinview up until Wimbledon Rd, and again after the school driveway.
- <u>Madison Dr</u> There is limited parking on Madison Drive with a path directly to school property.

Excel Drop Off in the Morning – Families can stop and drop off students registered in Excel from 7:30am -8:15am in the lower driveway circle.

Once supervision begins at 8:20, There is NO stopping in the lower driveway. Instead, families of students from Grades Primary to Grade Five are invited to head up the upper parking lot to access the Kiss and Go. Reminder – There is **NO** parking on school property for non-staff members during the school day.

Thank you for your assistance in keeping all our students safe as they arrive/depart each day.

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## Mi'Kmaq Heritage Month

Acknowledging this day increases awareness about the tens of thousands of Indigenous children throughout Canada who were removed from their homes and communities and sent to residential schools.
